

ACCOMPANYING THE DYING

With social distancing measures in place as part of tackling COVID-19, the physical presence of a minister or trusted member of a church community at the bedside is often not possible. This short resource takes you through what you can do in the absence of a priest or minister when you are supporting someone who is dying.

No two situations are the same. Please feel free to omit prayers as necessary. If more than one person is present, one or many people can lead these prayers.

PRAYERS AS DEATH APPROACHES

God of love,
give us peace as we pray to you.

Psalm 23 reminds us of God's loving kindness. We/I shall read it now.
*The Lord is my shepherd; therefore can I lack nothing.
He makes me lie down in green pastures and leads me beside still waters.*

*He shall refresh my soul
and guide me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.*

*Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil;
for you are with me; your rod and staff they comfort me.*

*You spread a table before me in the presence of those who trouble me;
you have anointed my head with oil and my cup shall be full.*

*Surely goodness and loving mercy shall follow me all the days of my life,
and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.*

Hear the words of Jesus from St John's Gospel
I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live.

God of mercy,
into whose hands your Son Jesus Christ
commended his spirit at his last hour,
into those same hands
we now commend your servant N.
that death may be for him/her the gate to life
and to eternal fellowship with you;
through the same Jesus Christ our Lord.

May the fellowship of the saints support and befriend you.
May Christ, the Good Shepherd,
embrace and welcome you.
May your rest be with him this day in peace
and your dwelling-place in the paradise of God.

When the person has died, this prayer may be said:

God of life,
We entrust N. to your mercy and loving care.
We thank you for all that was good in his/her life.
We pray for all who will mourn for N.
and for those who watch and wait and care for others,
in their time of need. **Amen.**
